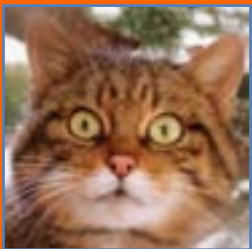

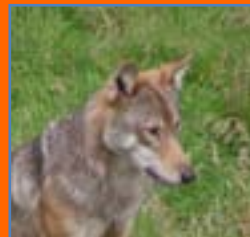

Did you know that...

Scottish wildcats are genetically different from domestic cats and there are only approx. 400 left in the wild?

They are more endangered than Amur tigers.

Did you know that...

Red panda's are **not** related to the giant panda, like those at Edinburgh Zoo?

They are more closely related to raccoons than bears.

They like to eat bamboo like their larger namesake, but will also eat fruit and meat as well.

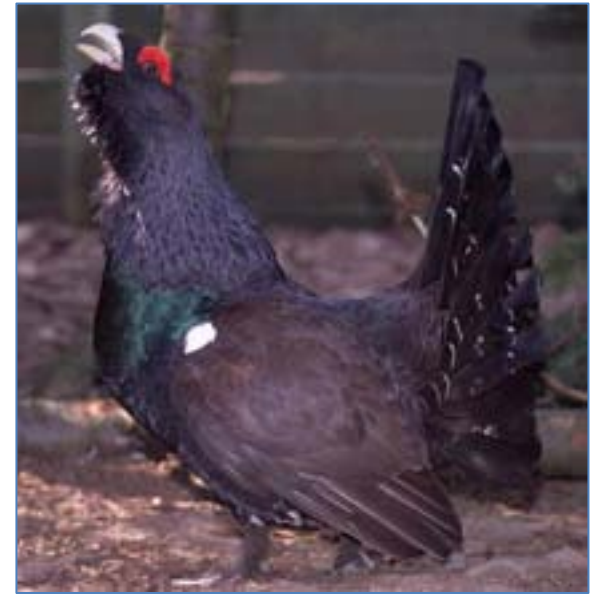

Did you know that...

Capercaillie is the largest member of the grouse family? It has gone extinct in the UK once and could go extinct again, if we don't conserve this iconic animal of Scotland. The name of this bird is derived from the Gaelic capull coille, meaning "*horse of the woods*" because its call sounds like horses hooves.

Did you know that...

Polar Bears (*Ursus maritimus*), or the *sea bear*, evolved about 200,000 years ago from brown bear ancestors?

Polar bears range throughout the Arctic, where they hunt seals. They are the largest land carnivore in the world. Polar bears are in decline because of global warming and could be extinct in the wild by 2100.

Did you know that...

Amur tigers are the largest sub-species of tiger and are primarily found in SE Russia and Northern China?

In the 1960's it was close to extinction, but its numbers recovered. Today and there are around 450 left in the wild.

Did you know that...

The wolf became extinct in Scotland in 1743, when the last wolf was killed by a hunter called McQueen?

Wolves are the largest of the canine family and are found all over the world. There are 32 subspecies of wolf in the world, 24 in North America and 8 in Europe.

Did you know that...

The Golden Fleece in the Greek myth of Jason and the Argonauts was probably from a takin?

There are 3 species of takin. The Mishmi takin is the national animal of Bhutan in the Himalayas. Takins are members of the goat-antelope family.

Did you know that...

The Great grey owl is found across the Northern Hemisphere in the boreal forest of North America and Europe?

It has the largest facial disc of any bird of prey. The facial disc is used to direct the sound of its prey to its ears, which are asymmetrical (at an angle to each other), this enables them to catch their prey without seeing it.
